## IBFAN Briefing for Member States: Agenda Item 12.6 Maternal, infant and young child nutrition A71/A/CONF./4. May 23<sup>rd</sup> 2018



The **Infant and young child feeding draft resolution** (sponsored by Botswana, Canada, Gambia, Georgia, Ghana, Mozambique, Nepal, Pakistan, Panama, Russia, Senegal, Sierra Leone, Thailand and Zambia) **is now opened for drafting.** 

The original draft resolution has provisions that protect –

- Baby-friendly Hospital Initiative
- The International Code and relevant WHA resolutions
- Guidance on Ending inappropriate promotion of foods for infants and Young Children (69/9)
- Guidance on infant and young child feeding in emergencies
- Safeguards on conflicts of Interest

We urge all Member States to work for a Resolution that is as health protective as possible, especially on the above 5 key areas, especially safeguard conflicts on interest in nutrition programmes.

Important to note that the **Maternal**, **infant and young child nutrition decision proposed by US does not** provide safeguards for the above 5 key elements.

Parts of the US proposed Decision that would be risky and could lead to a weakening of safeguards. (A71/A/CON./5)

OP5 to request to the Director General

(a) to provide, upon request, technical support to Member States in implementation, monitoring, and the assessment of recommendations, such as the Baby-Friendly Hospital Initiative, to support infant and young child feeding, including in emergencies, [and to review national experiences with implementing such recommendations and the mobilization of resources to build the evidence base on their effectiveness, and consider changes, if needed;]
